

Response from Paul Huber:

- 1.) Do you support the right of citizens to own firearms?
Yes. I am a strong supporter of the 2nd Amendment, and I believe that the right to bear arms is a fundamental individual, not a group, right. I support the Supreme Court's decision last term in DC v. Heller, that ruled in favor of the individual right for gun owners.
