Lenny McAllister's Responses

Please provide short answers to the following:

1.) Do you support the right of citizens to own firearms?

Yes, I do. It is an Amendment listed in the Bill of Rights. Self-protection is vital to the "pursuit of happiness" listed in the Declaration of Independence. Our founding fathers clearly saw how these two items were tied together, as do I.

2.) Do you support the actions of the EPA in trying to stop climate change?
