News From Around PA

31st House District saw a pro-life win in the Republican Primary on Tuesday as Anne Chapman easily beat the party endorsed pro-abortion candidate Helen Bosley.

182nd House District voters tossed ultra liberal Rep. Babette Josephs for open homosexual Brian Sims. He is the former president of Equality PA and the first open homosexual to be elected to the legislature. He has no opponent in Nov.

HB 1077 -- the ultrasound bill -- has stalled in the Legislature. Did you know that under the Supreme Court's 1992 decision in Planned Parenthood of Southeastern Pennsylvania v. Casey, states have a right "to ensure that a woman apprehend the full consequences of her

decision" and can require physicians to provide "truthful and not misleading" information about the abortion procedure and the development of the fetus. They need to move this bill forward!

Lock Haven University held its annual Spring Drag Show on April 20. The event was sponsored by the school's Gay Straight Alliance club and featured professional drag queen Scarlett Feva.

"Whole Woman's Health Funding Priorities Act," which will cut funding to Planned Parenthood, will soon be introduced by Rep. Daryl Metcalfe.

Middle Smithfield Township supervisors have voted to reverse a previous decision to allow strip clubs in their commercial district and will now restrict them to the industrial zone.

American Women's Services abortion clinic in Pittsburgh has been closed by the Department of Health.

is concerned that there has been a drop in the number of middle schools that teach about STDs and pregnancy prevention. The percentage of high schools requiring classes teaching condom usage has dropped also.
