a Mennonite-owned cabinet business in Lancaster County, has filed a lawsuit opposing the Obamacare mandate that they provide abortion and contraception coverage in their employee health insurance.

News from National Scene

In a speech before the **National Center for Transgender Equality**, Roy L. Austin Jr., Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Civil Rights, said the DOJ has investigated and taken action against hate crimes, school bullying, and, what he calls, "biased policing" that target the transgender community.

UN Population Fund,

and other non-governmental organizations hosted, Int'l Conference on Population and Development Global Youth Forum. Reps of Int'l Planned Parenthood Federation, World YWCA, and the World Association of Girl Scouts and Girl Guides were on the steering committee.
