News From Around PA

Geisinger Health System, headquartered in Danville, announced on Wednesday that it will no longer consider applicants who smoke for employment. They will be tested for tobacco just as they are for illegal drugs. Smoking will cut six to seven years from the lifespan of the smoker, meaning a cigarette habit less is dangerous to human health and longevity than homosexual sex, which can shorten a 'gay' man's life by up to 20 years!

Pennsylvania abortions in 2010 totaled 36,778. This represents a decrease of 506 or 1.4 percent from the 37,284 that occurred in 2009. Residents of Philadelphia made up 14,731 or 41.8 percent of all abortions. Of the 2010 PA abortions, 97.7 percent occurred in eight counties — Allegheny, Berks, Bucks, Chester, Dauphin, Delaware, Lehigh and Philadelphia.

13 New laws in Pennsylvania include anything from returning possession of a road to a township, naming roads and bridges to regulating abortion clinics.

Philadelphia has highest per capita murder rate in US with it currently standing at 324. And homosexual activists still want to boot the Cradle of Liberty Scout Council and its Explorers Program out of Philly!
