Chester County was approached by the Freethought Society about including a "Tree of Knowledge" with their Christmas display. The Commissioners declined and on Dec. 3rd 30 people protested the decision saying as non-believers they were being treated like second-class citizens.

Equality PA has stepped in to take former PA Human Relations Commission Chair Stephen Glassman's place as the biggest promoter of local homosexual special rights ordinances.

Susquehanna Township in Dauphin County last night approved by an 8 to 1 vote a so-called anti-discrimination ordinance with sexual orientation and gender identity language. As usual the AFA of PA contacted each of the nine commissioners with questions and real life

scenarios. Two residents spoke against the ordinance, but it was not enough to counter the intentions of the Board of Commissioners.
