Religious school supporters want PA lawmakers to bar the state from regulating and programs faculty members at church-run preschools and nursery schools. News from National Scene The **US Supreme Court** has announced it will hear two cases challenging the Obamacare provision requiring private businesses offer their employees contraception/abortion inducing drugs as part of their insurance coverage. They are Sebelius v. Hobby Lobby Stores, Inc. and Conestoga Wood Specialties Corp. v. Sebelius.

The U.S. Department of Education has announced details of a \$100 million "competition for high schools that better prepare students for college and high-tech careers." It is a mix between the federal Race to the Top and Investing in Innovation programs, and will be funded and run through the Department of Labor.

In May Robert Gates, U.S. Secretary of Defense during the time when Don't Ask Don't Tell was repealed, will begin a 2-year term as President of the Boy Scouts. AFA of PA encourages Christians, through education, to become involved in protheir family issues in community, state and the nation.
