News From Around PA
On October 20, Arcadia
University, in Glenside, will
host the Family Matters
Conference. However, this is
not good news as it is
sponsored by Philly Family
Pride which is " dedicated to
bringing together LGBTheaded families in the
Philadelphia region."

HB 2691 was introduced on October 3rd by outgoing State Rep Babette Josephs. It is a bill which mimics California's recently passed law banning 'reparative therapy.' If passed, it would prevent parents from seeking help for a child who announces he is homosexual.

Philly City Councilman-at-Large Jim Kenney has falsely stated that Chick-fil-A has changed its policies and would no longer donate to pro-family groups and, according to Kenney, has added 'sexual orientation and gender' to its non-discrimination statement. However, Chick-fil-A has not changed its policies -- still believes in Biblical marriage and has said from the beginning they will treat each person with respect.
