News From Around PA The Interstate Voter Registration Crosscheck is Program being implemented by the PA Department of State. Senator Bob Casey Jr. is worried that the new voter verification program will restrict participation.

Governor Tom Corbett is frustrated about the feds unwillingness to accept his plan to use billions of federal **Medicaid expansion** dollars to subsidize private health insurance for the working poor in PA.

The **PA System of Higher Education's** 14 universities are being allowed to submit proposals to adjust their tuition rates and certain fees charged to students under two-year pilot programs. **Philadelphia** wants to be added to the list of World Heritage Cities.

News from National Scene The number of Americans who were enrolled in Medicaid at any time during fiscal 2013 exceeded the entire population of the UK.

The latest **Rasmussen Reports** telephone survey finds that 59% of American adults share at least a somewhat favorable opinion of the Boy Scouts -- down 6% from last May.

Seven US Senators, including Bob Casey, Jr., have introduced the Tyler **Clementi Higher Education** Anti-Harassment Act of 2014, requiring federally funded colleges to instate policies banning harassment of students who identify as or are perceived to be homosexual or transgender.

The **Walt Disney Company** will cut funding to the Boy Scouts beginning in 2015 because of their policy that bans homosexual leaders .

Jessie J, the singer of the pop hit "Domino," has come out saying she is straight and looking to settle down with a man. The 26-year-old said her time as a professed bisexual "was a phase."

IRS Commissioner John Koskinen said the 150,000 comments received concerning proposed IRS changes will be reviewed; saying it is "unlikely they will be able to complete this before the end of the year."
