News From Around PA
In what was described as a
five-year demonstration
project, Pennsylvania got the
go-ahead to use federal
money to pay private
insurers to provide health
care to uninsured individuals.

A little-known policy FEMA 5 issued May would indefinitely ban the use of hazard mitigation assistance money for properties that could eventually host horizontal drilling and hydraulic fracturing. This policy immediately affects eight households in Pennsylvania that have suffered recent floods — five in Wyoming County and three in Lycoming County.

U.S. District Judge Arthur J. Schwab wrote in an opinion

that a series of National Labor Relations Board subpoenas for **UPMC** documents, including some that he said were issued at the behest of the Service **Employees** International Union, were far too broad. However, he granted the agency's application enforce them, while giving UPMC time to appeal.
