News From Around PA The DNC was the first presidential convention to feature all-gender bathrooms. Of all the Democrat Party delegates, "11.5% were LGBTQ and 28 were transgender men and women."

Montgomery County Judge Wendy Demchick-Alloy's recent ruling forbids Attorney General Kathleen Kane from bringing up her porn email investigation as part of her defense against charges of perjury, official oppression, and other crimes. Her trial is scheduled to begin on August 8th. Kane has claimed her ongoing legal troubles are retaliation by some to punish her for her porn email investigation.
