Penn State University's former **President Graham Spanier** received \$2.3 million in compensation last year, more than any leader of a public university.

National Collegiate Athletic Association filed a notice of intent to subpoena Scott Paterno, son of Joe Paterno. Many of the demands are for "all documents" about a certain topic, such as the Freeh report, or for "all communications" between Paterno and others.

SB 293 unanimously passed the House. It provides a framework for additional oversight on Obamacare navigators and exchange assisters.

It appears there could be more **premium hikes** and benefit changes on the way for those PA citizens shopping on the federal marketplace for health insurance.

In May **Philadelphia** launched an interactive online guide to help trans, gender-nonconforming and others locate gender-neutral restrooms in the region.

of Senate Α group Democrats, led by Sen. Patty Murray, D-Wash., introduced a bill Tuesday that would allow birth control pills approved by the Food and Drug Administration to be sold without a prescription. Sen. Cory Gardner, R-Colo. has introduced a similar bill. Gardner's bill would allow women to pay for them with a health savings account and puts an age restriction for access to adults 18 years and above. Murray's plan has no age restrictions and the entire cost would be covered by insurance.

The House is poised to easily pass a bill banning the taxation of Internet access.

but that bill will only shine a spotlight on a disagreement brewing in Congress over whether and how to tax sales made over the Internet.

The North Carolina House voted to override the governor's veto of a bill that protects the religious liberty of civil servants in that state. The Senate had already voted to override the veto, thus the bill becomes law.
