News From Around PA Twenty PA bakers and restaurateurs sign onto an amicus brief opposing baker Jack Phillips in the US Supreme Court case. Phillips was found quilty discrimination under Colorado's sexual orientation law, when he refused to bake a "wedding" cake for two who 'gay' men were otherwise frequent customers. The majority of signers were from Philadelphia, but also included Velvet Sky Bakery in Jenkintown, Grown Up Treats LLC in Chester, West Avenue Restaurant Dresher, Culinaragourmet in New Hope, Izenberg's Deli, Baker, Catering & Restaurant Conshohocken, Park Avenue Pastries in Chalfont and Love Bites in Easton.

On Tuesday voters elected the **first transgender candidate** in Pennsylvania.

Tyler Titus (a woman who thinks she's a man) won a seat on the Erie School Board

A "transgender woman" (a man who thinks he's a woman) is suing the Allegheny County Jail because they housed him with male inmates.
