A student refused to stand
for the Pledge of Allegiance
at Carlisle High School. The
substitute teacher asked him
to explain his reason and told
him, "maybe you would just
like to leave the country."
The substitute was dismissed
from school that morning
and will no longer be allowed
to substitute in the district.

As of the morning Oct. 11, last day to register to vote in PA, 8,569,445 voters were confirmed as registered in Pennsylvania, according to data provided by the state department, though that number is likely to grow significantly as registrations filed are verified and approved. County election officials have until Oct. 31st to issue the final voter list.

Gov. Tom Wolf nominated Patrick McDonnell, the acting **Secretary of Environmental**

Protection, to the role full time. His nomination must be confirmed by the Senate.

News from National Scene
The Alabama Supreme Court
Justices have recused
themselves from hearing the
appeal of Chief Justice Roy
Moore. But in a 5-3 vote, the
majority decided to allow
Acting Chief Justice Lynn
Stuart to work with the
Governor to randomly select
seven "retired" judges from a
pool of 50 judges.

Exxon Mobil is fighting back against New York's Democrat attorney general who is demanding decades' worth of documents about the company's position on global warming and climate change.

On September 29th the FCC voted unanimously to allow a foreign takeover by Chinese, Russian, Muslim Brotherhood front corporations. Once a foreign corporation scoops up a media business, such as a chain of radio stations, it can eliminate national and local programming and substitute its own government's propaganda. That means that conservative talkers could find themselves off the air.

A student at lowa State **University** is suing the school over what he calls an "unconstitutional speech code." The policy states that а 'gossip' about male student's 'feminine dress' could be harassment, failing to even acknowledge that students also possess First Amendment rights might be implicated. Failing to agree to abide by the policies could result in the school placing a "hold" on diplomas and a "review" by the dean.
