

Statement for February 21 2014 Press Conference

We may have our differences with Russia, but when it comes to their children and the efforts by homosexual activists to tell kids that 'gay is okay,' Russia has made the right decision.

Last year Russia sent a message to the world that their children are important. On June 11, 2013, the Russian parliament voted 436 to 0 to pass a total ban on homosexual propagandizing of children by foreign or domestic activists. They also do not allow adoptions into countries that have legalized same-sex marriage and are considered a ban on adoptions into Belgium because that country just legalized the killing of children through euthanasia. Russia is right in passing laws to protect her children -- her future. It should be noted here, that unlike what the media has portrayed, Russia did not ban homosexual behavior.
