Started by homosexual teacher, Kevin Jennings, it encourages students to start clubs to foster 'understanding' of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (GLBT) students. It also encourages students to take an active role in 'defending' and working for the 'civil rights' of GLBT. BUT how is this done?

- GLSEN has created a "Marriage Curriculum" that talks about the 'right' of same-sex marriage. This has been used by GSAs.
- GSAs take part in the April 'Day of Silence' in which students remain silent, place duct tape over their mouth and distribute GLSEN material throughout the school day to show support for same-sex marriage and special rights for homosexuals.
- Ally Week is a week long event each October. From GLSEN's website: "Participate in Ally Week by passing out stickers to allies who sign a pledge, or plan an event or series of events throughout the week."
- A new day of action this year is the "TransAction Day" planned for February 27th. It takes a look at transgenderism (those who think they were born in the wrong body).
- GSAs, with the help of outside organizations, '**convince**' their schools they need to change their anti-discrimination/harassment policies to include "actual or perceived sexual orientation and gender identity."
- Students have said **they did not know they were homosexual or transgender** until after they began attending their school's GSA.

Each of these "Days of Action" **hide behind the 'anti-bullying' mantra**, but GLSEN's goal is to validate the homosexual lifestyle. As a result, many times Christian students are bullied or teased because of their deeply held religious beliefs that homosexual acts are sinful. **WHAT CAN YOU DO?**
