News from Around PA

Conservative commentator, **Steven Crowder**, withdrew from a scheduled debate Friday at the University of Pennsylvania, alleging roadblocks put up by school officials. His opponent, history Professor Jonathan Zimmerman, has been critical of the state of free speech on college campuses, said the decision was wrong.

Under a settlement the **Delaware Valley School District** (Pike County) reached with the Obama administration, the district was required to permit male students who identify as transgender to use the girls' bathroom. In February, the Trump administration sent the district a letter saying it was rescinding the settlement. The school board has since voted to not allow males in female bathrooms.

Jefferson Community Hospitals Inc.'s was sued by a nurse who identifies as transgender claiming a "hostile work environment". The employer introduced

several reports of unsatisfactory care affecting patients weeks prior to the termination. The US District Court for the Eastern District of PA dismissed the case.

Carnegie Mellon University students from across the political aisle united in calling for a new free speech policy for The Fence, a landmark dedicated to open expression.

The **University of Pittsburgh's** Office of Inclusion is demanding that a student reporter delete interviews she did with willing participants during the school's "Trans Day of Vibing". Prior to the event, she received approval from the program director, but . . .

News from National Scene

With the signature of Governor Tate Reeves, **Mississippi** will become the eighth state to require individuals seeking a driver's license to mark 'male' or 'female' based on their biological sex, not gender identity.
