These include a bill that would require gun owners to report lost or stolen firearms: a bill that would require all guns to be sold with trigger locks and mandate that gun owners safely store their weapons; a bill calling for universal background checks for all gun purchases; and a red flag bill.

The Mars Area, Penncrest and Laurel school districts, as well as two teachers, several board members and parents, filed a lawsuit trying to stop the Shapiro administration from implementing "culturally relevant and sustaining education," also known as CRSE, in every school district in PA.

A resolution was introduced last month in the State Senate to recognize March as **"Problem Gambling Month n PA".** "The purpose of this resolution is to help ensure that the citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are informed about the issue of problem gambling and the programs available to help individuals and their families who have been adversely affected by this serious public health issue."

News From National Scene MN lawmakers are debating changes to the state's antidiscrimination laws which were introduced bv а transgender legislator. He wants to remove the "Sexual sentence orientation' does not include а physical or sexual attachment to children by an adult" from the current law. Another bill would create a new state registry for people who engage in "biased hate speech," even if it's not an actual violation of the law!

Six hundred and seventy professors at the University of North Carolina signed a letter protesting new legislation that would require college students to learn about America's founding documents ___ the Constitution, the Declaration of Independence, the Gettysburg Address and even the writings of Martin Luther King, Jr. calling it "ideological indoctrination."

ND Gov. Doug Burgum signed a pro-life bill into law that bans abortions starting at 6 weeks when an unborn baby's heartbeat can easily be detected. The measure takes effect and becomes state law immediately due to the emergency clause contained in the law.

Christian college Whitworth University's student denied the government request of campus group Turning Point USA to allow Chinese dissident Xi Van Fleet to speak at the university. The first to object complained that "his constituents" who are "people of color [and] identify as LGBTQIA+" were "very concerned" with Van Fleet's criticism of woke culture on Twitter.
