The app will help identify racially "offensive," "harmful" street names and "repair past wrongs." The app allows users to search for specific terms used in street names in North America and western European countries, provides exact locations and downloadable spreadsheets of the streets.

From National Scene 2023 the Indiana legislature passed a law that forbids taxpayer dollars from being given to the Kinsey Institute at Indiana University. The center is named after Alfred Kinsey, a professor who used the journal of a rapist to study the sexual behavior of children and is considered the father of the sexual revolution. Recently the General Attorney and Comptroller sent a letter expressing concerns about "the lack of transparency concerning its funding and the University's compliance with Indiana Code."

Olentangy Local School District in the Columbus, OH area has a policy requiring students to use preferred pronouns, or no pronouns at all, when addressing transgender students. Failure to comply can result in suspension or even expulsion. A lawsuit was filed by Parents Defending Education seeking an injunction against the policy, alleging it violated students' First and 14th Amendment rights. The Sixth U.S. Circuit Court of

Appeals ruled 2-1 that the district can enforce its policy.

Allan Josephson, psychiatrist and former professor at the University of Louisville, will hear soon whether the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals will take his case. He was fired after offering his personal remarks medical expertise on the treatment of patients with gender dysphoria in a panel discussion at a conservative organization.

Montana's Supreme Court ruled that minors don't need their parents' permission to get an abortion in the state – agreeing with a lower court ruling that found the parental consent law violates the privacy clause in the state constitution.
