Just how pro-abortion is **US Rep Madeleine Dean (PA-4)**? She posted a picture of herself wearing a golden lapel pin that read "ABORTION" with a stylized O with a heart inside. She tweeted, "I say the word, I wear the word. Abortion care is health care. Abortion care saves lives." At least one other Democrat wore this gift from Planned Parenthood during the State of the Union address.

LGBTQ activists have formed **Keystone Equality**. Its mission is "to get LGBTQ community supporters elected, facilitate LGBTQ voter participation and convey to government officials that LGBTQ Pennsylvanians have political power."

Many view **medical marijuana as the first step to legalizing recreational pot**. Chicago-based Cresco Labs is a national dispensary of medical marijuana and they just opened their 11th store in PA - located in Butler, two

News From National Scene

Connecticut state lawmakers introduced a bill that blocks **Freedom of Information Act requests** from acquiring teachers' discussions with kids on "sensitive subjects" such as race, sexuality and gender identity.

Florida is yanking **the liquor license** of the Orlando Philharmonic Plaza Foundation, saying the "Drag Queen Christmas" show was sexually explicit while being marketed to families.

The **US State Department's** is seeking to fund projects to promote and protect "Freedom of Expression." However, it notes that the \$750,000 grants will only be given to those whose programs "have strong support from and participation by lesbian and bisexual women, transgender and intersex individuals, and other gender diverse persons."

The documentary, titled "**Dead Name**", which highlights the horrors of gender ideology, was scrubbed from Vimeo before it had even been up for a month. Vimeo stated the film was "violating our Terms of Service prohibiting discriminatory or hateful content" – without saying what was discriminatory or hateful.

Bethany Hamilton has been participating in international surfing competitions since at least 1998. She is best known for her story in the film "Soul Surfer" telling of the shark attack which left her with only one arm. Recently the World Surf League announced it will allow men to compete with women; Hamilton responded that she will no longer compete if this rule remains in place.
