#### News From Around PA

**Norwin School District** (Westmoreland County) voted to remove mandatory streaming of a CNN-affiliated program in middle school classrooms, opting instead to let teachers decide whether they show the program. Teachers came out in force to oppose a total proposed ban on CNN, while many parents did not want their children indoctrinated into thinking CNN was a trusted source.

The **Philly Queer Doula Collective** was formed in early 2020, when “a group of five LGBTQ birthworkers in Philly got together to support one another as they battled through the highly gendered health care system.”

**Warren County Pride, Inc** has been approved by the IRS as a 501c3 organization. The Trinity Episcopalian Church in Warren helped then through the process and provides them a space to meet. Warren County Pride Day is scheduled for June 18<sup>th</sup>.

#### News From National Scene

**San Francisco residents** easily boot three of its most liberal school board members during a recall election. The voters’ concerns ranged from COVID policies to renaming 44 schools within the district because they were named after “racists” like George Washington and Abraham Lincoln!

**The American Rescue Plan**, which passed the US Senate with the tie-breaking vote of Vice President Harris, will spend \$30 million to distribute items like crack pipes to “underserved communities” like black, Latino, LGBTQ groups. West Virginia Senator Shelly Capito said Democrats recently voted down an amendment to the short-term spending bill that would have banned federal dollars from being spent on crack pipes.

Sales for the new woke bisexual **Superman comic books** nosedive. The first

book of Superman: Son of Kal-El only sold 68,800 issues back in July. That was good for the 17th best-selling comic of the month. The most recent data reveals that the book’s third issue only sold 34,000 copies in September. That was good for the 77th best-selling comic of the month.
