Biden, Joseph Jr. Expressway back to its original name -Central Scranton Expressway; requiring all lodging industry employers to use E-Verify. Bad Bills this week: protections for LGBTQ foster/ adoptive parents; teaching mindfulness in schools.

A Philadelphia "transgender woman" (biological male) says he was unfairly denied coverage for "trans-related" medical services by Cigna Health and Life Insurance Company. The denial letter states: "Facial feminization surgery is considered not medically necessary when performed as part of a gender reassignment." The "transgender woman" has filed a 23-page lawsuit.

The Lancaster Public Library has failed to promise that it will not hold Drag Queen Story Hours and other pro-LGBTQ events in 2025. As a result, East Hempfield and Manor Townships have voted to withhold funding.

News From National Scene In his private capacity, Idaho National Guard Major David Worley ran for mayor of Pocatello, Idaho, and during his campaign, he spoke out against drag queen story hours, explicit material in public libraries, and transgender treatments for children. A homosexual man under his command was not pleased with the statements and filed a discrimination complaint. The Idaho Army National Guard suspended Worley from command in July 2023 following the complaint. They are being sued! The lawsuit alleges that leadership "recommended all candidates command be scrutinized to ensure that their Christian beliefs, views, or expression are discovered prior to be given command and reported to the Department of Defense for investigation concerning extremist activity." The investigating

officer "recommended that there be No Christians in Command in the Idaho Army National Guard because of their 'concerning ideologies.'"

The **Supreme Court of Nassau County**, New York,
has upheld a local law
prohibiting trans-identified
males from competing in
women's sports. Opponents
of the measure promise to
continue their litigation
against it.

The Wisconsin-based Religion Freedom from Foundation sent a letter to every Ohio school district discouraging Ohio school boards from participating in LifeWise Academy. Ohio response, clergy supporting the academy sent a letter to over one-hundred Wisconsin school boards encouraging them to allow the voluntary Bible program their districts.
