News From Around PA On Wednesday Allentown City Council unanimously passed an ordinance which bans talk therapy for minors with same-sex attraction or gender confusion. Therapists trying to help will lose their license to operate.

Four **Boyertown School District** students have sued the district over its policy allowing students to use facilities corresponding to their stated gender identity saying it violates their privacy and amounts to sexual harassment. A hearing is scheduled in Easton on Monday.

Reading School District is being sued over allegations it has used \$500,000 of taxpayers' funds since 2011 to pay teachers for doing full-time union work instead of teaching students. They're known as "ghost teachers," teachers who are paid by public school districts while they work full time on unionrelated issues.

Haverford Township School **District** (Delco) has formed a committee of about 20 which includes teachers. quidance counselors, psychologists, administrators, nurses and social workers who represent all seven schools.(Note: There are no parents involved!) They are developing policy to address gender expansive/ transgender students. Three subcommittees have been formed to meet throughout the summer and reconvening on September 26th.

Pine-Richland School District

(Allegheny County) has voted 6-2 to rescind its policy that required students to use the facilities associated with their biological sex or use separate unisex facilities. "Juliet" Evancho, a recent graduate and brother of superstar Jackie Evancho, was one of the 3 plaintiffs.

While a federal lawsuit by a44 year-oldLackawannaCounty"transgender"prisoner is pending, a judge

has ordered the prison's medical contractor to resume giving Sparkles Wilson estrogen.

The Human Rights Campaign, the nation's largest homosexual lobbying group, is launching a \$26 million political organizing effort ahead of next year's midterm elections. The group is focusing its resources in particular on several key states: Ohio, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin. Arizona, and Nevada. It will focus on fighting legislation curbing "gay rights" and backing "pro-equality candidates and initiatives."
