Volume Issue 15, 12 March 29, 2025 Remember: Printable versions found online News from Around PA Good Bills this week: HR 131 urging the federal government to eliminate the REAL ID program; HB 1061 requiring proof of citizenship in order to register to vote. Bad Bills this week: SB 510 grants to help pay for 'transgenders' to change their names on legal documents; SB 477 – removing "sex" from birth certificates.

PA Supreme Court decision that was recently handed down stakes out a new pathway for determining parental rights -- intent-based parentage. Background: a "married" lesbian couple decided to "have a baby". One of the women became pregnant through artificial insemination. The couple broke up, leaving the one woman who was not pregnant without a clear path to claim she was a "parent" to the child. The court's decision now adds a fifth way for those seeking to claim a role as parents to a child: biology, parentage presumption, adoption, when a child is born to

parents who have signed a contract and used artificial means to become pregnant and now "intent-based parentage".

Bryn Athyn College in Montgomery County announced that they will end all of their sports programs and transition to club-only competition, citing financial difficulties. The change will save the college the financial equivalent of eleven full-time positions.

On Tuesday, Democrat James Malone defeated Republican Josh Parsons in the heavily GOP **36th Senate District in Lancaster County.** He won by 482. The seat had previously been held by Ryan Aument, who resigned in December to work for then US Senate-elect Dave McCormick.

On that same day the Democrat candidate won the special election in **Allegheny County,** thus giving the Democrats a one seat majority in the State House.
