According to a **National Center for Education Statistics** report, in 2021 Pennsylvania spent \$21, 547 per student in public education. There was a 1.9% jump in 2022 to \$22, 123. That's seventh in the nation and \$4,100 more than the national average.

Ignoring the concerns of parents, **Pennridge School District** board (Bucks County) has voted 5-4 to rescind its policy requiring students to use the bathroom that matches their biological sex. It will be replaced with an "administrative regulation", which places the decision making on the administration rather than a board policy. Activists hope that "it will accommodate the needs of all students". They were especially concerned that those supporting the policy "equated trans girls to boys". FACT: "trans girls" are biological males!!

Comcast, headquartered in Philly, proudly reaffirms its commitment to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI):

"We are working to fight injustice and inequity against any race, ethnicity, gender or sexual identity, disability, or veteran status." It also notes it received a score of 100% in the Human Rights Campaign Corporate Equality Index and was named a 'Best Place to Work for LGBTQ Equality'.

In Warren County, the town of **Warren's own LGBTQ+ Facebook group** is hoping to move beyond social media to create "events (to) allow members to forge meaningful relationships and create lasting bonds, from meet-ups and social gatherings to educational workshops and support sessions."
