Satanic Delco, after waging a months-long battle, has succeeded in ‘convincing’ the **Garnet Valley School District** (Delaware County) to drop its dress code rule banning clothing with satanic or cultic references. The Satanist group responded on Instagram, “students are now free to express their Satanism on equal footing, alongside their fellow students of every other religion”.

Democrats in the State House have begun circulating a **co-sponsorship memo** to “ensure that every birthing person can get the health care they need, we will soon introduce legislation that will allow registered nurse practitioners, nurse-midwives, and physician assistants to perform medication and aspiration abortions. The legislation will also remove language stating abortions can only be performed if a physician determines it is medically necessary and replace it with language stating the decision to have an abortion is the sole decision of the patient.”

The home of founder and president of The Kings’ Men, **Mark Houck**, was recently raided by the FBI. He was handcuffed and arrested for supposed violations of the FACE Act and taken to the Federal Building in Philly.

Senator Pat Toomey has indicated he will oppose HR 8404, the misnamed “Respect for Marriage Act”.

The **Presidential Election Reform Act** would “prevent presidents from trying to overturn election results through Congress”. It would make the vice president simply a figurehead overseeing the counting process, it would limit Congressmen’s ability to object and clarify a governor’s role. The bill was authored by US Reps. Liz Cheney (R-WY) and Zoe Lofgren (D-CA). Senator Pat Toomey has indicated he supports the bill.

News From National Scene
Disney, Facebook, Google, NBC Universal, HBO and others are partnering with the University of Southern California to produce pro-abortion films. The students must produce and create a short film about “reproductive health” – or

abortion – and the “Reproductive Rights Accelerator” will give three winning students \$25,000.

Yeshiva University in New York is temporarily suspending all undergraduate student club activities pending final resolution of a dispute over whether it will be forced to recognize an LGBT student group, just days after the U.S. Supreme Court refused to block a lower-court ruling ordering it to recognize the club.

The school board of **Maine’s Regional School Unit 22** was ordered to pay \$40,000 to an area father it tried to bar from public meetings and other community functions on school grounds for exposing the district’s adoption of radical and obscene sex-related materials in schools.
